"Now, Lord, consider their threats and enable your servants to speak your Word with great boldness." Acts 4:29

"Are you an old school or a bold school?" A few years ago, at a retirement and celebration of ministry, the retiring PSD principal used this quote in front of a large assembled group of people. He went on to state that his school was a bold school for a variety of reasons, including being on the forefront of technology implementation, curricular advances, having a gifted staff and sound educational practice. But then he said that while all of these excellent practices and people are in place, *the critical and most important reason that he considered them a bold school was because of their missional DNA - that they boldly proclaim Jesus as Lord and Savior to a community in desperate need of the HOPE that only Jesus Christ can give!*

Acts relates the spreading of the Gospel of God's grace both: 1) geographically (from Jerusalem through the eastern Mediterranean lands to the capital of the Roman Empire) and 2) theologically (from a small Jewish-Christian community to an extended church in which Gentile Christians equaled, if not surpassed, in number the believers among the Jews).

In Acts, we also read about the boldness and courage with which the apostles and early Christians proclaimed the Gospel message, and we know how God multiplied their ministry, despite threats, problems and adversity, and grew HIS church! What a great testimony to us as Lutheran educators as we read Acts and consider our classrooms, our schools, our congregations and our witness to our communities! This summer, I encourage (urge, beg) you to read the book of Acts by the pool, at the beach, in the shade of a tree in the desert, or while on vacation! Let the words and witness of some of these heroes of the faith like Peter, John and Paul motivate you to reflect upon this past school year and look forward to the upcoming school year with great boldness and courage!


LEC 2017 Made for More Slideshow--Send Your Pictures
