Hurricane Update from Houston Lutheran Schools

Hurricane Harvey - Lutheran South Academy Update from Gregg Pinick, CEO, Lutheran Education Association of Houston

October 17, 2017 Dear friends,

August 27th seems like a long time ago. The rains of Harvey had started and the first reports of water pouring into the Lutheran South Academy (LSA) facilities were being observed on the security camera system. It took until Wednesday, August 30th, to get onto campus and assess the damages and plan a strategy to get school started again.

Our God provides. Genesis 22 tells the story of Abraham offering his son Isaac as a sacrifice. God provided another sacrifice and Abraham named the place, Jehovah-Jireh - The Lord will provide.

The story of Hurricane Harvey and its effects on the LSA campus can be summed up by that phrase - Jehovah Jireh. Our God has provided all we have needed along the way.

Leaders? He led a construction manager from our parent community to oversee the demolition and rebuild. He led a Head of School to organize, encourage, and rally her team to go above and beyond.

Workers? He led over 1,000 people to volunteer the first three days to demo, remove, haul, sanitize, clean, mop, catalog, etc. People from all over did everything that was needed to get the drying out of the buildings in place by the evening of September 2nd.

Equipment? We were first on the list of getting the huge dehumidifiers on campus. All of the supplies to clean up were donated. Food and water to feed the crews came from many sources. Trash bins arrived on campus the day were started cleaning up. Few people in Houston had access to them, and we had them coming and going on campus.

Resources? Donations totaling over \$420,000 have poured in from all over the world (literally) from individuals and organizations. Vendors cut deals or replaced items for free. The people from the Iowa District West of the LCMS sent two semitrucks filled with 702 pieces of sheet rock, all the sheet rock supplies, appliances for school's rental house, gifts for our smaller children, gifts and furniture for our faculty and staff that experienced loss, and extra money in case they missed something. All delivered by a great driver named Troy (who looked a lot like Santa). Grants from the TX District -- LCMS, TX Mutual Insurance, LCEF, and private foundations continue to be granted.

Space? The largest church in our area, Sagemont Church, had four buildings with extreme flooding, and yet, offered their two remaining buildings, and over 150,000 sq. ft. of educational space so that LSA could reopen the entire school of 800 students and 100 faculty and staff on Friday, September 8th. Classes were held at Sagemont until Friday, October 13th. All the space we needed was available for ten (\$10). They lived out their mission of "being Living Proof, of a Loving God, to a

Watching World." Our connection there was David Juengel, a 1979 graduate of Lutheran High School North in Macomb, MI and classmate of LSA Assistant Principal, Gary Himmler.

Move back day at LSA occurred on Saturday, October 14th, and 400 more volunteers assembled to carry, haul, clean sanitize, purge, and throw away, to ready the buildings for Opening Day 3.0 on Monday, October 16th. School opened yesterday, and a community was glad to be back home!

The sheet rock is hung and painted. Flooring is nearly installed. Furniture is starting to arrive and supplies are coming in to help the faculty ready their learning spaces. Home football games have started. The gymnasium will be ready by the end of January.

We continue to mitigate a cost for reconstruction that is \$1 million more than the insurance coverages we had on the facility and contents. We are about half way to that goal and confident that God will continue His provision.

Words of thanks cannot express the love and support LSA and the LEAH Schools have felt this past nearly eight weeks. Thank you for the prayers. Nothing is too big for Our God.
